I hope that each you have had a wonderful summer, even though it has flown by. I hope that every Pastor and Church Staff Minister has been blessed with time away with their family to rest, relax and make some great family memories! Every summer I am reminded of the words of Vance Havner who wrote "**Come ye yourselves apart..., and rest a while**" (Mark 6:31) is a must for every Christian. If you don't come apart, you will come apart!"

One of the personal joys of serving as your Director of Missions has to do with being an encouragement to those who so faithfully serve our churches and also assisting our churches in any way possible (Coaching & Consulting). It has been an absolute blessing to have an opportunity to be an encourager to our Pastors just as Onesiphorus was to the Apostle Paul (2 Timothy 1:16). 4. Let them know that they are appreciated.

5. Thank them for going the extra mile when it comes to planning and carrying out the church mission trip, VBS or taking the kids to summer camp.
6. Encourage them to take some time away with their family for rest and relaxation BEFORE the kids head back to school in a few weeks.
7. Make it a point to also be an encouragement to their spouses as well. Often times Ministers spouses feel unappreciated and taken for granted.
8. Thank them for going above and beyond as they minister where God has placed them.
